

## THE UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE CONDUCT OF BACHELOR OF TECHNOLOGY (B.TECH.) EXAMINATION

Notwithstanding anything contained anywhere in the Regulation otherwise decided by the Executive Council, it is hereby provided that the Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech) Examination will be held according to the following Regulation. The Kalyani University Executive Council makes this Regulation in exercise of the power conferred upon it by section 49 of the KALYANI UNIVERSITY ACT, 1981 (amended up to 2001).

1. The course for the Degree of Bachelor of Technology (B. Tech) of Kalyani University shall be of four years duration divided in to four parts, viz. Part-I. Part-II. Part-III and Part-IV. Each part shall have two semesters first Semester and second Semester. The First semester classes shall normally begin in the first week of July and the second Semester classes in the third week of January.
2. There shall be an examination conducted by the University at the end of each Semester as per the programme announced by the Controller of Examinations. These examinations are to be called as Semester-I and Semester-II of Part-I, Part-II, Part-III and Part-IV Examination respectively.
3. A candidate shall be allowed to appear at any semester examination if he/she has attended 75% of above lectures delivered/practical classes held during that semester. If the attendance of any candidate falls short of 75% but not below 60%, he/she will be allowed to appear at the examination as non-collegiate candidate on payment of requisite fees. Candidates attending less than 60% classes will be treated as discollegiate and will be debarred from appearing at the examination.
4. Each semester Examination will comprise of theoretical and sessional papers. The number of theoretical and sessional papers will be as per the curricula and syllabi prescribed by the respective Board of Studies/Academic Expert Committee, and approved by the Faculty Council and the Executive Council. The paper setters, Examiners, Moderators, Co-ordinators etc. For each semester examination will be appointed by the Controller of Examination on the recommendation of the concerned board of Studies/ Academic Expert Committee and as approved by the Vice-Chancellor.

The proficiency attained by a student in a part of the examination shall be assessed in the manner indicated below:

### **a) Theoretical Papers**

On the basis of the marks obtained by the student

- i) In internal assessments made by the college/department/Centre , on the basis of test examinations within a semester and carrying 30% of the total marks of each paper and these marks will be retained for (FS)or (FR) candidates.
- ii) In semester examination of papers in Part-I, II, III and IV to be conducted by the University at the end of each Semester carrying 80% of the total marks in each paper.

### **b) Sessional**

One the basis of the marks obtained by the student in assessment of his/her sessional by the college/department/Centre on workshop/laboratory, work records and viva-voce, during each semester carrying 100 marks in each paper.

5. The semester Examination of theoretical paper carrying 80 marks shall be normally of three hours duration while a paper carrying 40 marks shall be normally of two hours duration.
6. In order to pass a semester examination of the B.Tech course, a candidate must obtain at least 40% of the full marks in each theoretical paper including the marks allotted for internal assessment and 50% of marks in each sessional paper of the semester.
7. A candidate who fails to qualify or fails to appear at not more than two theoretical papers will be treated as Failed but Supplementary (FS) and will be allowed to prosecute studies in the next semester. He/she will be allowed to appear at supplementary examination for those papers in which, he/she failed along with the regular examination of that semester in the next year.
8. If a candidate fails to qualify or fails to appear at more than two theoretical papers in a semester or fails to qualify or fails to appear in one or more sessional papers in examination of Part-I/Part-II/Part-III, he/she will not be eligible to be enrolled as a student in the next semester. He/she will be treated as Failed but Repeat (FR), However, he/she will retain the marks/credit for the papers already qualified and he/she may appear in the next examination of the semester for only those papers including sessional in which he/she has failed. On qualifying in those back papers he/she will be eligible for enrolment in the next semester of the concerned part.
9. A candidate who has failed in not more than four (not more than two in a semester) theoretical papers, herein called back papers, in the examination of Part-I/Part-II/Part-III and has not failed in any sessional papers of that part may be allowed to prosecute studies in the next part subject to the provisions of Rule 10. Such a candidate will be allowed to appear in the back papers in supplementary examinations which will be conducted along with the regular first and second semester examinations of each part. He/she will be deemed to have passed the examination of a part as and when he/she will qualify in the back papers of that part in supplementary examination(s), subject to the fulfilment of all other provisions of this Regulation.
10. Candidates studying for Part-III examination shall be required to pass the back papers, if any of Part-I and/or Part-II in supplementary examination(s) before or during Part-III examinations, failing which he/she shall not be allowed to join classes for the Part-IV Examinations. Candidates studying in Part-IV shall be required to pass in such back paper(s) of part-III in supplementary examinations(s) before or during Part-IV examinations. Such candidate who obtains qualifying marks in Part-IV second semester examination but fails to qualify or fails to appear at the supplementary examination will be kept withheld. The same will be published only when the candidate will qualify in the supplementary examination of Part-III within the stipulated chances.
11. A candidate will be eligible for admission to a semester examination of a part of B.Tech. Course provided that
  - i) He/she has been enrolled to that semester of that part of the course with requisite qualification.
  - ii) He/she does not exceed the time limit or number of chances to pass that part of the course as follows:
    - a) A candidate must pass in all subjects (both theoretical and seasonal), of Part-I, Part-II, Part-III and Part-IV within eight academic years, counted from the date of his /her first enrolment to the first semester of Part-I failing which he/she will be debarred from appearing at any further examination.

b) A candidate must pass in all subjects (both theoretical and sessional), of Part-I, Part-II, Part-III, and Part-IV within eight academic years, counted from the date of his/her first enrolment to the first semester of Part-I, failing which he/she will be debarred from appearing at any further examination.

c) If a candidate is eligible for supplementary examination as per Rules 7, 8 and 9, the total number of times he/she may appear in the supplementary examination for a particular paper shall be limited to three consecutive chances (one regular and three supplementary). If he/she fails to pass the paper within this stipulated number of attempts he/she will be debarred from appearing at any further examination and will not be allowed to prosecute further studies in the college/department/centre.

12. The overall performance of a successful candidate shall be assessed on the marks obtained by him/her in Part-I, Part- II, Part-III, and Part-IV examination added in the following manner:

a) 25% of the total marks obtained by a candidate in the semester examinations of Part-I, and Part-II (next whole number in case of fraction) and

b) 100% of total marks obtained by a candidate in the semester examinations of Part-III, and Part-IV

The candidates securing 66% or more of the total marks calculated as above shall be placed in the first class. All other successful candidates shall be placed in the second class.

13. Where a candidate is permitted to appear at supplementary examination or to appear as a whole in any semester as per 7, 8, 9 and 10 of this regulation, he/she will be required to apply to the Secretary, Faculty Council (PG) for enrolment as a casual/supplementary candidate within fifteen working days of the publication of the result of relevant examination.

14. There shall be no re-examination of answer scripts relating to the examination leading to the degree of Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech). However the students may apply through Head of the Institute in prescribed format for post publication scrutiny (PPS) of answer scripts for not more than two theoretical papers for any semester examination on payment of prescribed fees (same as re-examination fees) within fifteen days from the publication of result of the concerned semester examination. Scrutiny does not mean re-evaluation of scripts; it counts for totalling of marks and pointing out omissions (if any). Application for Post Publication Scrutiny shall be restricted to theoretical papers only and no application for Post Publication Scrutiny in practical papers shall be entertained.

15. The Written answer scripts of each semester will be preserved up to six months from the date of publication of result. After that period the scripts will be disposed of.

16. If in any case, notwithstanding any contravention of the existing Act/Statute/Ordinance of University of Kalyani, the Vice-Chancellor of the University shall have the power to settle any issue which is not covered under this Regulation.
